My Brethren,

Some thoughts on the Twenty-four Inch Gauge.

In some jurisdictions Freemasons are taught that the Twenty-four Inch Gauge is divided into three equal parts. While the gauge of the operative mason always will be divided into three equal parts, could it not be that our Symbolism is better when we divide our Symbolic Gauge into three parts, without a measurement of time for each part. Masons should be able to divide their time in a way that is becoming to Masonry.

An important point that may have been overlooked by some Brethren is the is that the Twenty-four Inch Gauge leaves no wasted time. Even the time allotted for refreshment and sleep is not wasted since it prepares a Mason for the service to God and his fellowman as well as his necessary vocations. Rather than idle time, I'm sure we have all said at least once, if not more often, there isn't enough time in the day. And so it may be for the Mason who seriously considers the Lessons and Symbols which have been presented to him, and gives them the time required to study, understand and exemplify them.

If the Twenty-four Inch Gauge teaches one thing it is that a Mans' and Masons' day is a full one. There is no time that should be wasted away.

Time is the only thing that men have in equal amounts. It should be divided into portions and used wisely, any second wasted is lost forever. Time is the one commodity that can never be recovered.


