My Brothers,

On 21 February, the Orient of Colorado will begin a 60-day fundraising program, to raise funds for a perpetual scholarship fund in the name of our Past SGIG – Illustrious and Most Worshipful Stephen Munsinger.

This fund will be used to award an annual scholarship to Colorado students, with preference being given to the family members of Colorado Masons, or to Colorado Masons themselves.

The scholarship program will be coordinated through the Scottish Rite Foundation of the Supreme Council but raising the funds to support the scholarships rest on the shoulders of the Scottish Rite Brothers of Colorado.

Donations will be tax-deductible, as the Scottish Rite Foundation is a 501(c)(3) organization. Donations can be made by check or by credit card. Instructions on exactly how to make the check payable, or who to contact directly for credit card payments, will be sent out to all members shortly.

There is no minimum donation, and all amounts are welcome. Of course – "the more, the merrier!!"

Some of us work for firms that will match such charitable donations, and I hope that all of us will endeavor to seek out those contributions as well.

This scholarship enables us to do at two things:

- contribute to the higher education of our citizenry, which is a key tenant of our Scottish Rite philosophy and degrees
- honor the name and accomplishments of one of the finest Scottish Rite Masons that most of us have ever known

I ask that all of you think carefully about this program and consider contributing to this amazing effort for the good of Freemasonry and the good of the people of Colorado.

I will personally match the first \$ 1,000 of donations contributed by the Valley.

So how did your lodge cope with the recent plague? Some of the brothers of UGLE (that's United Grand Lodge of England, not to be confused with any ugly brothers) found a brilliant way to pass the time while engaging in regular fellowship. They started the first Masonic beer lodge, the Masonic Craft Beer Society (MCBS). The MCBS grew out of a group of Masons during the lockdowns of

Covid. They were using Whatsapp and Zoom to keep in touch. Every Friday night they found the discussion would turn to the different beers they were drinking. They then decided to launch a FaceBook group with the idea of creating a database of beers and a rating system for them. Within 24 hours they had around 300 members all eager to take part. The intention was to unite Masons and take their mind off the monotony of the lockdowns. Before long there were about 2500 members in the FaceBook group. One of their goals was to celebrate and promote craft breweries. Local breweries were contacted to see if they would be interested in joining the zoom calls to present their products. Boxes of beer from the featured breweries were sold to members prior to the meetings so they could take part in a virtual tasting session. These virtual meetings eventually transitioned to in person meetings. In the summer of 2020 about 70 members were able to take part in a social where three beers were presented by a member who was also a commercial brewer.

Horus Lodge No. 3155 was warranted on 22nd February 1906 and consecrated on 14th May 1906 at New Gaiety Restaurant, Strand, London. Despite their long history the lodge was struggling to stay together post-covid. Eventually the brothers of MCBS were approached and asked if they would be interested in taking over the struggling lodge. On May 22 the MCBS held their first meeting under the warrant of LodgeHorus No. 3155 where they had petitions for over 100 new members. The MCBS drew members from Durham, Lancaster, Kent, Dorset, Scotland, Ireland, Spain, Bolivia, Canada and Ghana and even one member from the US. For now, they are planning two meetings per year where they will get together at Freemasons' Hall, Great Queens Street, London in Lodge Room 10, the Egyptian Temple, which suits the Horus name. MCBS also continues to be an E-lodge conducting online tastings and discussions as well. One other thing the brothers are especially proud of is the charity aspect of the lodge. They created and quickly sold MCBS badges and were able to donate £1,000 to charity from the proceeds. The virtual happy hour still continues along with the festive board of Horus. But Horus is now their official home.




