My Brothers,

We have just over 30 days until our Spring Reunion!! I am always excited to be able to spend time with my Scottish Rite brethren and our new candidates.

LOTS and LOTS of things to get ready.

- Casts will be rehearsing --- and we will be adding additional degree work for this Reunion.
- Supporting Departments will be getting property, costumes, lights, sound equipment, and A/V equipment checked and readied
- Our Classroom team will be reviewing material, presentations, A/V equipment, and getting ready to communicate many degrees to our candidates

During the three days of the Reunion, we will confer 29 degrees on our candidates, covering a host of moral and civic topics, and even some with a bit of political and religious themes intertwined with them. It is a tremendous effort, and it is the cornerstone of setting our newest Scottish Rite Masons on their path to learning, understanding, and exploring so many different philosophical issues and ideas.

Brethren,

Last month I wrote about understanding the roles and responsibilities I have as the Commander of the Council of Kadosh. This month, I want to update the consistory and ask for some feedback on one of those responsibilities. This year, I am a part of the Membership Committee led by WB Blake Simmons. As a part of that committee, I am in charge of the Ambassador Program. This was an existing program that, from my understanding has faltered through the Covid years, that we are looking to refresh. The goal is to have at least two ambassadors for each of the Blue Lodges our Consistory membership consists of.

Every month, my plan is to email the ambassadors selected, a few items concerning the Scottish Rite. I would ask these representatives to announce those items at their Lodges, without interrupting the meeting (for instance during the 'good of the order'). For instance, the email for April might read something like: "The Scottish Rite will be having an open meeting to all Masons and guests on April 1st, starting at 7pm. The Chapter of Rose Croix will hold a Remembrance and Renewal Ceremony to pay honor and tribute to the Brothers we've lost last year and renew our fraternal bonds. We will also be having our Spring Reunion April 23-25th to put on degrees for our candidates. Please let me know if you'd like more information." The email would also contain the flier for the Rose Croix Ceremony to share with brothers if asked.

What this program is:

- A way to inform Blue Lodges of the work we are doing as Scottish Rite Masons
- A point-of-contact for Masons who are interested in joining the Scottish Rite
- A resource for the Masters of Lodges as we work on rolling out our Education Plan as part of the membership committee (expect to hear more throughout the year).

What this program is NOT:

- An explicit recruitment effort. There is a fine line here between telling the lodges what we do and explicitly recruiting members.

Freemasonry and Family – A lesson learned the hard way.

At its heart, Freemasonry teaches us a beautiful truth: our first and most sacred duties are to our Creator, our country, and our families. The fraternity was never meant to be a substitute for a happy home; rather, it's a set of tools intended to help us become better, more present versions of ourselves for our spouses and children.

When the lines blur is not always detectible. What starts as a genuine commitment to a noble cause can slowly, almost imperceptibly, begin to take up more space than we intended. We tell ourselves that one more meeting or one more event is "important," and we promise our loved ones we'll make it up to them later.

If you've found yourself making those promises more often lately, please know you aren't alone—but also know that your family feels that absence. When we unintentionally push our families to the side, we risk losing the very foundation of support that allows us to be Masons in the first place. Prioritizing the Lodge over the home can lead to a quiet distance, strained hearts, and a sense of regret that no title or degree can ever truly fix.

Turning the compass toward home. The good news is that the solution is found within the very lessons we cherish: Put your family first. If you feel the need to repair a connection, here is how you can begin that journey with grace.

Start with heartfelt conversations: Sit down with your family for an honest, calm talk. This isn't about winning a debate; it's about listening. Try to truly see things from their perspective. When they speak, listen without planning your defense. Validate their feelings, remembering that in our homes—just as in our Lodges—we are all "on the level."

Include them in the journey: Before committing to a new event, check in with your family first. Make them partners in your schedule rather than afterthoughts. Even if they can't attend a tiled meeting, invite them to the dinner or plan a family activity in the same city. Make them feel like they are part of your world, not competing with it. Action rebuilds trust: Words are a start, but trust is built through consistent, reliable presence. Show them through your actions that they are your top priority.

Pride has no place in healing: There is no shame in seeking a helping hand. If the distance feels too wide to bridge alone, a counselor or therapist can provide the tools to help you communicate more effectively.

Freemasonry and family life don't have to be at odds. In fact, when managed with love and intention, they can enrich one another. By placing your family back at the center of your life, you aren't just being a better man—you are truly living the principles of the Craft.

We look forward to seeing you there!

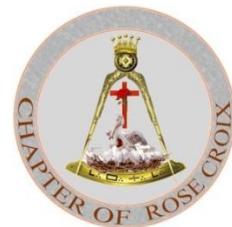
